DISK is in the process of setting up **Google Apps for Education** account (domain) for students and teachers. This new system will enable us to better communicate, share, and collaborate as an educational community, and it represents an important step towards developing a 21st century approach to curriculum and learning. From September 2015, all staff and students will receive a new Google email address:

What will Google Apps for Education offer DISK?

Google Apps for Education will allow DISK to be connected to a common e-mail, chat and calendar system (Gmail, Google Talk and Google Calendar), cloud collaboration tools (Google Docs, Google Sites, & Google Groups) and multimedia tools (Google Video for Education).

What are the benefits of Google Apps for Education and what's included?

- Anytime, anywhere access Google Apps works in any browser on any computer, which means you can access your email, calendars, and documents from school or at home.
- No flash drives required with documents and files stored in Google Docs.
- Students can easily collaborate with students from other classes, buildings, schools, districts or even different countries, working together on group projects.
- Teachers can be involved throughout the whole assignment process providing comments and feedback directly in the documents.
- Students can develop an e-portfolio of work throughout their years at the school.
- Through websites, calendars, and email, parents can stay informed about the latest assignments and activities.

Over the course of the 2015-2016 school year and beyond, DISK will begin to make full use of Google Apps for Education (ThinVol will become a document archive), all commonly used information will be accessed via shared folders on the Google Drive. A thorough understanding of Google Apps for Education and the ability to make use of its capabilities will be expected of all staff.
